MINISTRY OF THE MONTH: HOMEBOUND MINISTRY

The primary mission of the homebound ministry is to allow each homebound parishioner the opportunity to receive the Eucharist weekly and to honor the homebound parishioner's status as a member of our parish faith community through parishioner-to-parishioner visits.

Knowing that some parishioners at St. Augustine and St. Matthew may not be able to attend Sunday Mass, the Boyne Valley Catholic Community Homebound Ministry is actively helping.

Parishioners are considered homebound if they are unable to attend Sunday Mass due to mobility and/or health issues. The homebound ministry is meant to serve parishioners for both temporary or ongoing issues.

How It Works

Currently, ten Boyne Valley Catholic Community parishioners are certified to be homebound ministers and are able to make weekly visits taking the Eucharist to those parishioners who are homebound. A minister is matched with each homebound parishioner, and a day/time visit schedule is arranged. These visits can be set up on a regular weekly basis or on an "as-needed" basis. Jim Guyor helps coordinate this ministry.

Becoming a Homebound Minister

Parishioners who are currently Eucharistic ministers and wish to become homebound ministers would complete an online certification session through the Diocese of Gaylord. As a homebound minister, the parishioner is then contacted about a possible match with a homebound parishioner and a day/time visit schedule is arranged. These visits can be set up on a regular weekly basis or on a temporary or "as-needed" basis. If interested in becoming a homebound minister, please contact the parish office at 231–582–7718.
